### British Columbia

BC’s spectacular natural beauty and mild climate have made the province a world class travel destination. From skiing to culinary tourism to a plethora of parks and trails, BC gives the 4.9M international overnight visitors and 13.6M domestic overnight visitors per year a very special experience. BC’s product offerings, proximity to the US and its west coast location (which serves as the gateway to the rest of Canada for visitors from the Pacific Rim and Asia) contributed to a 7.7% increase in visitor volume and tourism revenues climbing to \$14.6B in 2015.

Tourism, food, and accommodation make up one of the fastest growing sectors in the province. In 2014, Destination BC reported the sector employed over 127,500 people, paid \$4.3B in wages and had over 19,000 tourism-related businesses. The sector has contributed steadily to BC’s gross domestic product (GDP), accounting for \$7.1B in GDP in 2014.

### Coquitlam

The City of Coquitlam is a vibrant, diverse and growing community of 144,668, which is uniquely situated in the heart of Metro Vancouver. Coquitlam’s diversified local economy provides businesses with excellent access to labour, transportation and markets. The City of Coquitlam’s growing business community is driving job creation and economic growth. Tourism plays a role in supporting some of Coquitlam’s major business sectors including retail, accommodation, food services and entertainment.

Entertainment and festivals such as the Festival du Bois and the BC Highland Games & Scottish Festival, combined with the City’s wealth of heritage sites, parks, trails and recreation facilities, provide something for residents and visitors alike.

## Accommodations

Coquitlam has four hotels, one motel, and 5 bed and breakfasts (B&Bs). The hotels and motel, which provide 415 rooms, are concentrated near the western border of Coquitlam, close to both the Trans-Canada and Lougheed highways. Hotels in Coquitlam offer a suburban location, lower costs and reasonable travel time to downtown Vancouver.

Coquitlam's B&Bs are less dependent on proximity to downtown and are located throughout the city. Many of the B&Bs enjoy scenic views of the local mountains and are within close proximity of the cultural and recreational venues and natural assets.

## Dining and Shopping

Coquitlam delivers dining options to suit many tastes and occasions. Our ethnically diverse population provides distinct dining options with menus from countries around the world including Brazil, China, Italy, Japan, Korea, Philippines, Russia and Thailand. Coquitlam offers a variety of menu alternatives such as upscale steak houses, family-friendly diners, sushi bars and neighbourhood pubs.

## Arts & Culture

In 2009, Coquitlam was designated a Cultural Capital of Canada in recognition of the contribution of culture to the community's identity, quality of life and economic development. Coquitlam offers a rich history and heritage, which grew

from the community's First Nations and French-Canadian roots, and a growing arts and cultural community. Cultural sites and centres like the Evergreen Cultural Centre, Mackin House, Place des Arts, Place Maillardville and many others, provide a wide array of cultural experiences and adventure.

The City of Coquitlam has also become a popular destination for festivals and events with over 100 events occurring each year such as the the BC Highland Games, Coquitlam Celebrates Canada Day, Festival du Bois and Treefest.

## Parks & Trails

The City of Coquitlam has over 80 municipal parks and natural areas totaling over 2,200 acres. Many include picnic areas and playgrounds, outdoor pools, spray parks, sportsfields and skateboard parks. Some excellent provincial, regional and municipal parks include:

- ❖ **Blue Mountain Park** – one of Coquitlam’s original parks. It offers an urban forest setting with sports fields, a wading pool and spray park.
- ❖ **Colony Farm Regional Park** – 404 hectare park that provides hiking and cycling trails, access to waterways (Fraser and Coquitlam Rivers), community gardens and wildlife areas.
- ❖ **Como Lake** – a natural setting experience that includes a one kilometre lakeside loop trail.
- ❖ **Coquitlam Crunch** – a 2km trail that connects Eagle Ridge Park to Eagle Mountain Park and has a challenging elevation gain of 250 metres.
- ❖ **Lafarge Lake** – a five-hectare man-made lake, located in Town Centre Park.
- ❖ **Minnekhada Regional Park** – 432 acres featuring trails, picnic facilities and wildlife areas.
- ❖ **Mundy Park** – 430 acres including walking trails and two scenic lakes, Mundy Lake and Lost Lake.
- ❖ **Pinecone Burke Provincial Park** – 94,000 acres with access to excellent hiking and mountain biking opportunities.
- ❖ **Town Centre Park** – within the hundred acres visitors will discover many opportunities for nature appreciation, sport and casual play, and cultural celebration.

## Sports Recreation

Coquitlam has a variety of high quality civic facilities dedicated to recreation, including Town Centre Park sports fields, City Centre Aquatic Complex, Poirier Forum and the award-winning, \$50-million Poirier Sport & Leisure Complex. Coquitlam’s sport facility inventory has led to the community hosting international, national and provincial sporting events.
