#### 5. Arts, Culture & Heritage Strategic Plan / Culture Services Overview

The Cultural Services Manager and the Cultural & Community Events Supervisor provided the Committee with an on-screen presentation entitled "Arts, Culture & Heritage Overview April 13, 2023" that covered the following topics:

- Parks, Recreation & Culture Master Plan 2017
- Vision of the Arts, Culture and Heritage Strategic Plan 2015 2030

- Coquitlam's cultural and community partners' impact on cultural programming
- City involvement in arts, funding and programming
- Festival Planners Network
- Festivals and events in Coquitlam including the Canada Day Event, Summer Concert Series, Kaleidoscope Arts Festival, Cultural Summit and Lights at Lafarge Winter Lights Display Kick-off Event
- Park and facility opening events that celebrate the creation of new public amenities
- Public Art Policy & Project Plan
- Riverview Hospital Artifact Collection and the City's efforts to catalogue artifacts from the Hospital and other heritage sites
- City Archives
- Status of the Heritage Management Strategy

The Vice Chair provided comments on the Heritage Management Strategy's success and noted that the future of the heritage collection displays is yet to be determined. Furthermore, the Coquitlam Heritage Society is working to find, save, and preserve historical buildings and artifacts.

Discussion ensued relative to the following:

- Whether there is a cultural map or list of art groups/resources within Coquitlam
- Whether the City has a public art staff person
- Why many art projects are developer driven
- Possible educational component such as a travelling museum for Riverview Hospital Artifact Collection
- Suitcase artifact project performed conjunctly with Douglas College
- The difficulty of preserving more delicate artifacts
- History of mental health and healing component of art

#### 6. Public Art: Civic Facility Visual Arts Display Program

The Culture Services Manager provided the Committee with the second half of an on-screen presentation entitled "Arts, Culture & Heritage Overview April 13, 2023" that covered the following topics:

- Visual arts display opportunities
- Visual Arts Display Pilot Project at Pinetree Community Centre

Discussion ensued relative to the following:

- Budget and honorariums for artists
- Consideration of logistics for display and protection of art from possible damage
- Charging fees to allow public access to art works
- City-owned space accessible for the pilot project
- Frontal Exposure Program Grant and its support of individuals installing artwork in vacant spaces within private buildings
- Downtown Vancouver Business Improvement Association initiative to revitalize downtown alleyways with competition among Simon Fraser University (SFU) visual art students

### 8. Committee Member's Roundtable / Emerging Cultural Issues

The Committee members were invited to share details regarding upcoming events or emerging issues in their communities. The following information was shared:

- Whether there is a long-term plan for an entertainment district in Coquitlam
- Low SFU student engagement and hard time bringing students back to campus for inperson classes and events
- Lack of a public gathering space in Coquitlam
- Impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on young adults including missed trips and graduation ceremonies
- Evergreen Cultural Centre's reintroduction of rehearsal hall sessions to attract emerging artists and expanded summer arts programs
- Challenges for older residents to attend events due to mobility issues and concerns of lingering pandemic effects
- Declining number of volunteers in the community and the need to attract younger volunteers
- BC Dumpling Festival in August at Town Centre Park
- Concern from Scotsfest BC that Town Centre Park developments will affect their plans and setup for the BC Highland Games Event in June
- The necessity for designated public spaces for events
- Fatigue of stereotypical cultural programming at community events
- May as the Asian and South Asian History Month
- Coquitlam Pride at Evergreen event held on July 15, 2023 at the Evergreen Cultural Centre
- Charles Best Secondary Gay-Straight Alliance presentation at Council-in-Committee meeting held on February 27, 2023
- Coquitlam Public Library events including Beers and Books at Mariner Brewery, Dragon Boat Story Time, and Día Internacional del Libro (International Book Day)
- Provincial Government Multiculturalism and Anti-Racism Grants that help the Coquitlam Public Library fund its public speaker series events
- Tri-Cities Pride Society resuming its operations
- Death threats towards queer teachers from abroad
- The need for "safe spaces"



# What is a Strategic Plan?

- Contains organization's vision, missions, values, strategic goals and broad statements about how goals will be achieved and measured
- Strategic Plan was last updated for 2020-2023; this is the first opportunity to renew the plan against the 2032 vision
