Coquitlam's Northeast Community Centre Moves to Design Phase

Following public feedback and further staff assessments, Coquitlam's Northeast Community Centre is moving into design with the confirmation of the proposed building amenities and spaces, including a larger pool.

Staff are now designing the planned community centre on Burke Mountain, incorporating a six-lane lap and leisure pool similar in size to Poirier Sport and Leisure Centre, along with gymnasiums, fitness, library, community space and other services.

Stage 2 Water Restrictions in Effect August 4

Metro Vancouver activated regional Stage 2 water use restrictions starting August 4. All residential and non-residential lawn watering and watering of grass boulevards is banned, including hand watering, until further notice. No new permits for watering new lawns or lawns being treated for the European Chafer Beetle will be granted in Stage 2. Permits issued in Stage 1 remain in effect until they expire.
