Untold Fraser Mills Stories

City Archives staff have pieced together fascinating insights about Fraser Mills. The former sawmill site (and up-and-coming new neighbourhood in south Coquitlam), was once an independent municipality with its own elections and taxes.

It was also a multicultural community that included not only people of Francophone and European heritage, but also people of Japanese and South Asian descent. Archives staff have learned about some of the more than 800 residents through records such as financial accounts, hospital invoices and letters.

Keep Your Live Tree Healthy to Keep Your Family Safe

Fire prevention and safety is always important, but even more so at this time of year when we have more lights, people and activity in our homes. Don’t let your live tree become a fire hazard. When choosing a fresh cut tree, pick one with needles that are difficult to pull off the branches and make a fresh cut off the bottom when you bring it home. Keep the trunk in water, refill the water every day and place it at least one metre away from heat sources.
