#### **1. INSTRUCTIONS TO PROPONENTS**

#### 1.1. Acknowledgement

The City acknowledges with gratitude and respect that the name Coquitlam was derived from the həńqəminəm word kwikwəλəm (kwee-kwuh-tlum) meaning "Red Fish Up the River". The City is honoured to be located on the kwikwəλəm (Kwikwetlem) traditional and ancestral lands, including those parts that were historically shared with the sqəćiya? təməxw (Katzie), and other Coast Salish Peoples.

#### 1.2. Purpose

The City of Coquitlam ("City") requests Proposals from professional, qualified, experienced companies to supply, deliver, install and warranty ("Services") of approximately 1,000 m2 of new rubber Sport Floor Tile and Baseboard at the Poirier Sport and Leisure Complex (PSLC).

#### 1.4. Proposal Submission

Proponents should complete and submit the information requested in this RFP document on the Proposal Submission Form or in a format that has been approved and is acceptable to the City.

#### 1.5. Instructions to Proponents

Proponents are advised that the rules for participation that will apply to this RFP are posted on the City's website: <u>Instructions to Proponents</u>

By submission of a Proposal, the Proponent agrees and accepts the rules by which the RFP and selection process will be conducted.

a) Proponents are responsible to inspect the existing site(s) and shall fully understand the difficulties and restrictions for execution of the Work under this Contract. Interpretations by the Proponent of the meaning of any section of the Contract drawings and specifications herein prior to submitting a price for the Work shall not remove the responsibility of completing the Work as per the directions of the City, including all costs associated with that Work, should the Proponent's interpretation be incorrect.

- b) Prior to submitting a price for the Work, the Proponent must seek clarification from the City for any items within the drawings and specifications that may appear to be unclear or conflicting.
- c) Prior to bidding, Proponents should visit, inspect, and familiarize themselves with the site(s) and of everything and of every condition potentially affecting the Works to be executed, so that the execution of the Contract by the successful Proponent is founded and based upon the Proponent's own examination, information, and judgment. Failure to visit the site(s) prior to the Proposal Closing Date will in no way relieve the successful Proponent from the necessity of furnishing any material or performing any Work that may be required to complete the Work in accordance with the conditions and specifications without additional cost to the City.
- d) It shall be the responsibility of the Proponent, by personal inspection of the site(s) of the Works, examination of the Contract documents, calculations, tests, and by requesting any required clarifications from the City, to become satisfied with respect to the quantities, quality, and practicability of the Work. The Proponent must be aware that any information from the City was and is approximate and speculative only and cannot in any manner be warranted or guaranteed. If the Proponent fails to make a proper investigation and examination of the site(s) and the Work they shall signify by entering into the contract that they are willing to assume all risk of the Work proving more onerous than was contemplated and/or assumed when the Contract was signed.

- e) Figure dimensions of a drawing shall take Figure dimensions of a drawing shall take precedence over measurements scaled from the drawing and large-scale drawings take precedence over those of a smaller scale. Supplementary drawings and specifications supersede their antecedents. Addenda drawings take precedent over all drawings. Addenda specifications take precedent over all specifications. In case of conflict between figured dimensions on a drawing and the dimensions of a specified product, the dimensions of the specified product will govern. The drawings and specifications complement each other and anything called for by one will be as binding as if called for by both.
- f) All information requested for the Proposal is to be completed by the Proponent on the supplied forms only and shall be based upon the whole of the specifications and Contract documents, without reservation. A Proposal that does not include all of the above sections, completed as specified herein, may be rejected.

- g) The selected Proposal shall supply all materials, equipment, installation, commissioning, and construction necessary for the successful starting and completion of the project in accordance with the drawings and specifications herein. It shall be the responsibility of the Proponent to include in the submitted Proposal amount sufficient amounts to cover the cost of the Work and materials required to complete the Work but not specifically noted in the drawings and/or specifications. It is assumed that all taxes, duties and levies have been included in the Proposal amount.
- h) Complete sub-contracting of Works will not be approved; however, segments of Work involving special skills may be sub-contracted.
- i) The Proponent must indicate the names of the Proponent's senior staff for the project, specifically identifying the project superintendent, and the names of the major sub-contractors and the Work they will be performing.
- j) The Proponent must carefully examine the Proposal Documents and worksite(s). The Proponent may not claim, after the submission of a Proposal, that there was any misunderstanding with respect to the requirements and conditions imposed by the City of Coquitlam.
- k) There will be no opportunity to make any additional claim for compensation or invoice for additional charges that were not considered and included in the Proposal price submitted, unless the City, at its sole discretion, deems that it would be unreasonable to do so, or there are additional Work requirements due to unforeseen circumstances.
- All information in this RFP Document, Drawings, Specifications, Site Visit and Investigation, and any resulting Addenda will be incorporated into any Contract between the City and the successful Proponent, and therefore must be considered by the Proponent in preparing their Proposal.

#### 1.6. Prices

Prices shall be all-inclusive and stated in (Canadian Funds). Prices shall remain FIRM for the completion of the Services.

Prices shall include the provision of all tools, materials, equipment, labour, transportation, fuel, supervision, management, overhead, materials, traffic control, services, all necessary packing and crating (where applicable), Canadian Customs import and export duties, freight, handling, insurance, all other associated or related charges, foreign, federal, provincial and municipal taxes, bonding costs, all licences, permits, inspections and all other requirements necessary for the commencement, performance and completion of Services as described.

Taxes are to be shown separately at time of invoicing.

The lowest price of any Proposal will not necessarily be accepted but will be analyzed to determine best overall value.

#### 1.7. <u>Requested Departures</u>

The Proponent acknowledges that the departures requested in the Proposal Submission Form will not form part of the Contract unless and until the City specifically consents in writing to any of them. The City may not consider any departures not stated in the Proponent's Proposal Submission.

The City reserves the right to check references on other projects even if they are not specifically listed. Information obtained from references will be confidential and will not be disclosed to any Proponents.

These criteria will be used to determine best overall value to the City as well as any other criteria that may become evident during the evaluation process.

The City may, at its discretion, request clarification or additional information from a Proponent with respect to any Proposal and the City may make such requests to only selected Proponents. The City may consider such clarifications or additional information in evaluating a Proposal.

Incomplete Proposals or Proposals submitted on forms other than the Proposal Form may be rejected.

Proponents agree the City may disclose names of Proponents and total award amount, however, unevaluated results, unit prices, rates or scores will not be provided to any Proponents.

The City reserves the right to reject without further consideration any Proposal which in its opinion does not meet the criteria it considers essential for the Work outlined in this RFP.

Where only one Proposal is received, the City may reject such and re-issue the RFP on a selected basis.

1.9. <u>Eligibility</u>

For eligibility, and as a condition of award, the successful Proponent would be required to meet or provide the equivalent:

- a) Commercial General Liability (CGL) insurance \$5M coverage provided on the <u>City's Standard Insurance Form</u>
- b) <u>Prime Contractor Designation Form</u> and be responsible for all the Work at the site in accordance with WCB regulations
- c) Be registered and provide WorkSafeBC clearance

- d) Accept the City's standard Terms and Conditions posted on the City's website: <u>Standard Terms and Conditions - Purchase of Goods and Services</u>
- e) A City of Coquitlam or Tri Cities Intermunicipal Business License

These items are not required as part of this Proposal Submission but will be required prior to entering into an agreement with the City for Services.

#### 1.10. Project Timelines

#### 2. GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

#### 2.1. Terms and Conditions of Contract

The City's <u>Standard Terms and Conditions - Purchase of Goods and Services</u>, as published on the City's website, the Conditions listed in this RFP, along with the accepted Proposal, addenda and any subsequent clarifications, correspondence, the totality of which will constitute the Contract.

#### **PROJECT SPECIFIC TERMS AND CONDITIONS**

#### 2.2. Frequency of Invoicing

Contractor to Invoice on a monthly basis for Work that has been completed up to date of invoice and not previously invoiced and paid.

#### 2.3. One Year Guarantee

The Contractor shall guarantee to maintain the Work and materials against any defects arising from faulty installation, faulty materials supplied under the Contract, or faulty workmanship, which may appear within one (1) year from the date of acceptance of the Work by the City. Faulty or damaged materials shall be replaced, and any defects discovered or failures which occur during the guarantee period, shall be rectified to the satisfaction of the City on-site within 2 weeks of notification. This shall be at no cost to the City.

#### 3. SCOPE OF SERVICES

3.1. <u>Scope</u>

The Work includes, but is not limited to, design, supply, delivery, installation, provision of all labour, supervision, equipment, tools, materials, transportation, and incidentals necessary for a complete turnkey system for **Poirier Sport and Leisure Complex Arena 2 Flooring Replacement.** 

The Scope of Work includes but not limited to:

- Removal, disposal or recycle existing sport flooring in accordance with all applicable codes, regulations and statutes.
- Supply, deliver, install and warrant approximately 1,000 square metres of new sport floor tile
- The Contractor shall prepare concrete surface as per the flooring manufacturer's recommendations.
- Supply & install rubber sport floor tile. Flooring at a minimum should:
  - Be resistant to Skate cuts
  - Vulcanized rubber, with no waxes or finishes
  - o Include safety and traction to prevent falls and injury
  - Withstand humidity and temperature changes
  - Flooring to match flooring in arena 3
- Where possible the existing toeless cove base should be left in place.
- Supply and install transition strip as required for flooring height differences. (at the end of each working day, ensure all trip hazards are addressed).
- Remove, supply and install baseboards to match existing.
- Non-toxic and low VOCs glue to be used.

#### 3.2. Staging of Work

There is limited on-site storage for the materials required to complete the work.

Rubber Floor Tile and other supplies will need to be delivered to the job site as work progresses. The Contractor must plan to store the materials, and as the work progresses bring the requirements necessary to complete the scheduled area's installation.

Prior to commencement of the project, the Contractor will determine with the City's Project Coordinator, an appropriate location for an on-site disposal bin.

#### 3.3. Protection of Public

The Contractor shall take adequate measures to protect the public, City staff, and all others on site from injury, damage, or other loss resulting from maintenance operations and related activities.

The Contractor shall promptly report to the City any safety incidents as they occur.

The Contractor shall at all times be responsible for maintaining safety zones around the worksite with safety barricades and signage.

#### 3.4. Public Relations

Good public relations must be maintained at all times by the Contractor, the Contractor's employees, and representatives. All enquiries and complaints must be satisfactorily resolved in a courteous and businesslike manner and be acted upon within a 24-hour period.

#### 3.5. Work Hazards

- a) It is the responsibility of the Contractor to address all Work hazards that could be reasonably expected on any job site(s) and to develop both training and written policy and procedures, where necessary, for the protection of the workers and the general public.
- b) It is the responsibility of the Contractor to monitor compliance and where necessary correct and/or discipline workers.

#### 3.6. <u>Clean Up</u>

At the end of each day the Contractor shall ensure the site is safe and secure and, at the conclusion of Work, the Contractor shall clean out all debris promptly remove any equipment or materials and leave the site of the Work in a clean and tidy condition.
