

## COQUITLAM AT A GLANCE



Immigrants represent over 40% of Coquitlam's Population, with the top three countries being China, South Korea and Iran.




### **AGE DISTRIBUTION**





### **HOUSEHOLD INCOME**




#### **POPULATION ETHNIC ORIGIN**

#### **BUDGETED REVENUE (\$267M)**






#### **RESIDENTIAL & COMMERCIAL PROPERTY TAX INCREASE**

For a number of years, Coquitlam has been shifting the commercial property tax burden, in recognition of our commercial tax rates being historically higher in comparison to other municipalities. Once again this year, Coquitlam applied a 1% tax shift from its commercial properties to the residential property class. The cumulative effect of this shift has been 22% over the past 22 years and this long-term strategy has assisted in supporting Coquitlam businesses and ensuring our business tax rate is competitive and attracting jobs to Coquitlam.









#### **TOTAL CONSTRUCTION**










#### TOURISM PROGRAM—NUMBER OF COMMUNITY EVENTS
