DEFINITIONS

"Agreement" "Contract" means the contract for services or City Purchase Order that will be issued to formalize with the successful Proponent through negotiation process with the City based on the proposal submitted and will incorporate by reference the Request for Proposals, Specifications, Drawings, any additional subsequent information, any addenda issued, the Proponent's response and acceptance by the City.

"City" "Owner" means City of Coquitlam;

"Contractor" means the person(s) firm(s) or corporation(s) appointed by the City to carry out all duties, obligations, work and services described in the Request for Proposal and all associated documentation, which may also include mutually agreed revisions subsequent to submission of a Proposal. Both "Contractor" and "Proponent" are complementary in terms of duties, obligations and responsibilities contemplated at the Request for Proposals stage, through evaluation process, execution and performance of the services and Works.

"Price" means the amount that will be paid by the City to the Contractor for delivery and acceptance of goods and Services;

"Project Manager" means the City staff member appointed to coordinate the Work;

"Proponent" means responder to this Request for Proposals;

"Proposal" means the submission by the Proponent;

"Request for Proposals" "RFP" shall mean and include the complete set of documents, specifications and addenda incorporated herein, and included in this Request for Proposals;

"Services" "Work" "Works" means and includes the provision by the successful Proponent of all services, duties, and expectations as further described in this RFP. This will also mean the whole of the Work, tools, materials, labour, equipment, travel, and all that is required to be done, furnished and performed by the Contractor;

"Shall" "Must" "Will" "Mandatory" means a requirement that must be met;

"Supply" "Provide" shall mean supply and pay for and provide and pay for.

1. INSTRUCTIONS TO PROPONENTS

1.1. Acknowledgement

The City acknowledges with gratitude and respect that the name Coquitlam was derived from the həńq́əmińəṁ (HUN-kuh-MEE-num) word kʷikʷəλ́əm (kwee-KWET-lum) meaning "Red Fish Up the River". The City is honoured to be located on the kʷikʷəλ̇́əm traditional and ancestral lands, including those parts that were historically shared with the qićəý (kat-zee), and other Coast Salish Peoples.

1.2. Purpose

The purpose of this RFP is to invite proposals from qualified firms for the provision of **Metal Fabrication Services.**

1.3. Proposal Submission

Proponents should complete and submit the information requested in this RFP document on the Proposal Submission Form or in a format that has been approved and is acceptable to the City.

1.4. Instructions to Proponents

Proponents are advised that the rules for participation that will apply to this RFP are located: <u>Instructions to Proponents.</u>

By submission of a Proposal in response to this RFP, the Proponent agrees and accepts the rules by which the bid process will be conducted.

1.5. Prices

Prices shall be all-inclusive and stated in (Canadian Funds). Prices shall remain FIRM for the Term of the Contract.

Prices shall include the provision of all tools, materials, equipment, labour, transportation, fuel, supervision, management, overhead, materials, traffic control, services, all necessary packing and crating (where applicable), Canadian Customs import and export duties, freight, handling, insurance, all other associated or related charges, foreign, federal, provincial and municipal taxes, bonding costs, all licences, permits, inspections and all other requirements necessary for the commencement, performance and completion of Services as described.

Taxes are to be shown separately at time of invoicing.

The lowest price of any Proposal will not necessarily be accepted but will be analyzed to determine best overall value.

1.6. Requested Departures

The Proponent acknowledges that the departures requested in the Proposal Submission Form will not form part of the Contract unless and until the City specifically consents in writing to any of them. The City may not consider any departures not stated in the Proponent's Proposal Submission.

1.7. Evaluation Criteria

The City uses Microsoft Word to aid the transfer of Proponents information to an evaluation document. Proposal Submission Form responses should provide direct answers or a concise summary of attachments. If attachments are required, ensure to provide a summary for each question then direct the City to the appropriate section within the attachments.

Lower scores may be recorded if Proposal Submission Forms are:

- Not in Microsoft Word
- Only answering questions with "see section x in attached document".

And, upon selection of one or more lead Proponent(s):

The City reserves the right to check references on other projects even if they are not specifically listed. Information obtained from references will be confidential and will not be disclosed to any Proponents.

These criteria will be used to determine best overall value to the City as well as any other criteria that may become evident during the evaluation process.

The City may, at its discretion, request clarification or additional information from a Proponent with respect to any Proposal and the City may make such requests to only selected Proponents. The City may consider such clarifications or additional information in evaluating a Proposal.

Incomplete Proposals or Proposals submitted on forms other than the Proposal Form may be rejected.

Proponents agree the City may disclose names of Proponents and total award amount, however, unevaluated results, unit prices, rates or scores will not be provided to any Proponents.

The City reserves the right to reject without further consideration any Proposal which in its opinion does not meet the criteria it considers essential for the Work outlined in this RFP.

Where only one Proposal is received, the City may reject such and re-issue the RFP on a selected basis.

1.8. Eligibility

For eligibility, and as a condition of award, the successful Proponent would be required to meet or provide the equivalent:

- a) Commercial General Liability (CGL) insurance \$5M coverage provided on the <u>City's Standard Insurance Form</u>
- b) <u>Prime Contractor Designation Form</u> and be responsible for all the Work at the site in accordance with WCB regulations
- c) Be registered and provide WorkSafeBC clearance

- d) Accept the City's standard Terms and Conditions posted on the City's website: <u>Standard Terms and Conditions - Purchase of Goods and Services</u>
- e) A City of Coquitlam or Tri Cities Intermunicipal <u>Business License</u>

These items are not required as part of this Proposal Submission but will be required prior to entering into an agreement with the City for Services.

1.9. <u>Term</u>

The initial term of the Contract is two (2) years with the option to extend the Contract by additional terms, upon mutual agreement of the parties.

2. GENERAL CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT

2.1. Terms and Conditions of Contract

The City's <u>Standard Terms and Conditions - Purchase of Goods and Services</u>, as published on the City's website, the Conditions listed in this RFP, along with the accepted Proposal, addenda and any subsequent clarifications, correspondence, the totality of which will constitute the Contract.

PROJECT SPECIFIC TERMS AND CONDITIONS

2.2. <u>Underground Services</u>, <u>Utilities and other Structures and Services</u>

The Contractor is directed to make special enquiry of the authorities, companies, individuals owning or operating all, conduits, cables, tracks and other structures and services, and to determine their character and locations and verify the accuracy of the information obtained.

The City of Coquitlam does not ensure the accuracy of such information and that any such information shown on Drawings is furnished as the best available, and is to be interpreted as the qualified Contractor deems appropriate. The City disclaims all responsibility for its accuracy or sufficiency.

2.3. Approval

In all cases where approval or direction is required, it shall be provided by the City's Project Manager.

3. SCOPE OF SERVICES

3.1. <u>Scope</u>

The City of Coquitlam ("City") requests Proposals from qualified, experienced Proponents to provide **Metal Fabrication Services** on an "as needed and when requested" basis.

Services to include but not limited to the following:

- Design
- Prepare
- Fabricate
- Deliver and install

Examples of typical works would include custom sinks, countertops, cabinets, backsplashes, HVAC ductwork, toilet partitions, custom requests. Typical works would be constructed of mild steel, stainless steel, hardened steel, and aluminium.

3.2. **Qualifications and Requirements**

Contractors should demonstrate to the City's satisfaction that they meet the following requirements:

- a) Trades people must have a related trades qualification certificate of proficiency from an accredited program or an equivalent program, plus at least one (1) year of related experience or an equivalent;
- b) Working knowledge of materials, methods, and equipment used in construction and maintenance work. Skilled in the use of construction equipment;
- c) Ability to effectively understand and carry out written and verbal instructions;
- d) Ability to work independently with minimal direct instruction and to interact effectively with staff and the public;
- e) Ability to work independently with minimal supervision and within tight time deadlines;
- f) Good understanding of safe work practices;
- g) Comply with WorkSafeBC, City regulations and other regulatory requirements as deemed necessary to the project;
- h) Analytical / problem solving skills;
- i) Service Quality

Registered apprentices may be assigned to City projects provided they work under the direct supervision of a Contractor's trades qualified Journeyman in accordance with trade regulations.

3.3. <u>Responses and Callouts</u>

- a) Unless otherwise advised, regular working hours and ordinary working days are 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Monday through Friday. No work will be performed outside of regular working hours or on other than ordinary working days without the prior direction or approval of the City. For all scheduled work, the Contractor will report punctually at the work site to perform the work diligently and expeditiously for completion of the work in a timely manner.
- b) Notwithstanding the preceding paragraph, the Contractor may be required to carry out work outside of the regular working hours or ordinary working days without the prior approval of the City, where it is necessary in the interests of safety of the Works or where the work is required to protect property. In such

circumstances the Contractor shall inform the City in writing of the circumstances as early as possible.

- c) If the Contractor wishes to carry out work outside of the regular working hours or ordinary working days and approval is given by the City, but the reasons for working these hours are for the Contractors benefit, then the hourly rate for such work will be at the normal hourly rate.
- d) Work hours paid under the Agreement shall be only for productive hours at the job site. Time spent for transportation of workers, material acquisition, handling and delivery, or for movement of Contractor owned or rental equipment is not chargeable directly but is overhead and the cost shall be included in the hourly rates for basic labour or equipment.
- e) The Contractor shall establish a list of key contacts with telephone numbers from 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday to Friday, for the purpose of responding to all calls from the City. There should also be a contact after hours for emergencies.
- f) The City reserves the right to obtain the services of an alternate source if the Contractor fails to provide such services within the specified time.

3.4. Protection Measures

- a) Access to any job site(s) through areas other than a road or paved areas specifically for that purpose is not permitted without the prior written approval of the City.
- b) The Contractor is to take all reasonable precautions to prevent damage to any structure within or adjacent to the site of the work. The Contractor is to report any damage caused to the City, and in the case of private property, to the property owner and/or occupant.
- c) Costs to rectify damage to structures arising from or in the course of the work will be charged to the Contractor.
- d) Repairs to any damage caused by the Contractor to be completed within five (5) working days.

3.5. Work Hazards

- a) It is the responsibility of the Contractor to address all work hazards that could be reasonably expected on any job site(s) and to develop both training and written policy and procedures, where necessary, for the protection of the workers and the general public.
- b) It is the responsibility of the Contractor to monitor compliance and where necessary correct and/or discipline workers.

3.6. Disposal of Unwanted Materials

The Contractor is accountable for the disposal of all excess and scrap materials. The job sites, at all times must be kept clean of any debris to avoid mishaps and all unwanted

materials must be disposed of in an environmentally friendly manner at approved sites with no extra expense to the City

3.7. <u>Clean Up</u>

At the end of each day and at the conclusion of work, the Contractor shall promptly remove any of his/her equipment or materials and leave the site(s) in a clean and cleared condition.
