Tree of Life (A Passage in Time), 2023

Location: 928 Brunette Avenue

Artist: Laura Kwok

This mural blends time and color together into a vibrant landscape that celebrates the local landscape. The multi-coloured leaves of the tree represent a healthy community, full of life and colour, with its roots running deep.

Artful Connections, 2023

Location: 952 Brunette Avenue

Artist: Lay Hoon

A vibrant celebration of the unifying potential of art, transcending language barriers and bringing together people from diverse backgrounds. This mural captures the essence of creativity as a universal language.

Inspired Community, 2023

Location: 953 Brunette Avenue

Artist: Angie Quintanilla Coates

This mural celebrates the artist in everyone and the feeling of inspiration through community and belonging. Bright colours and cool shapes come together to inspire imagination.

Le Bûcheron and La Violoniste, 2015

Location: Mackin Park (1046 Brunette Avenue)

Artist: Michael Campeau

These sculptures of a lumberjack (Le Bûcheron) and violin player (La Violoniste) were commissioned by Société Francophone de Maillardville in partnership with Canada – British Columbia Official Languages Agreement on French-Language Services. They were created in 2015 during Festival du Bois, an annual event at Mackin Park.

Pioneer Spirit, 2010

Location: Mackin Park (corner of Brunette Avenue and King Edward Street)

Artist: Douglas R. Taylor

This sculpture commemorates the 1909 to 2009 Centenaire de Maillardville/Maillardville Centennial. Similar to a weathervane, the piece provides a way-finding presence in the heart of Maillardville. The kinetic sculpture celebrates the many people who have called this community home over time.

Sto: Lo (River) Bear, 2007

Location: Place des Arts (1120 Brunette Avenue)

Artist: Carman McKay

This bear was created as part of the Spirit Bears in the City of Coquitlam, a project created by the British Columbia-Lions Society for Children with Disabilities. This sculpture was donated to the City of Coquitlam by Polygon Homes.

Through the Looking Glass, 2023

Location: Place des Arts (1120 Brunette Avenue)

Artist: Jocelyn Sanchez

A vibrant Alice in Wonderland-inspired mural on the Place des Arts Renaissance building. Created by youth and led by mural artist Jocelyn Sanchez to support the Summer Theatre Troupe's outdoor performance of Through the Looking Glass, which occurred onsite in 2023.

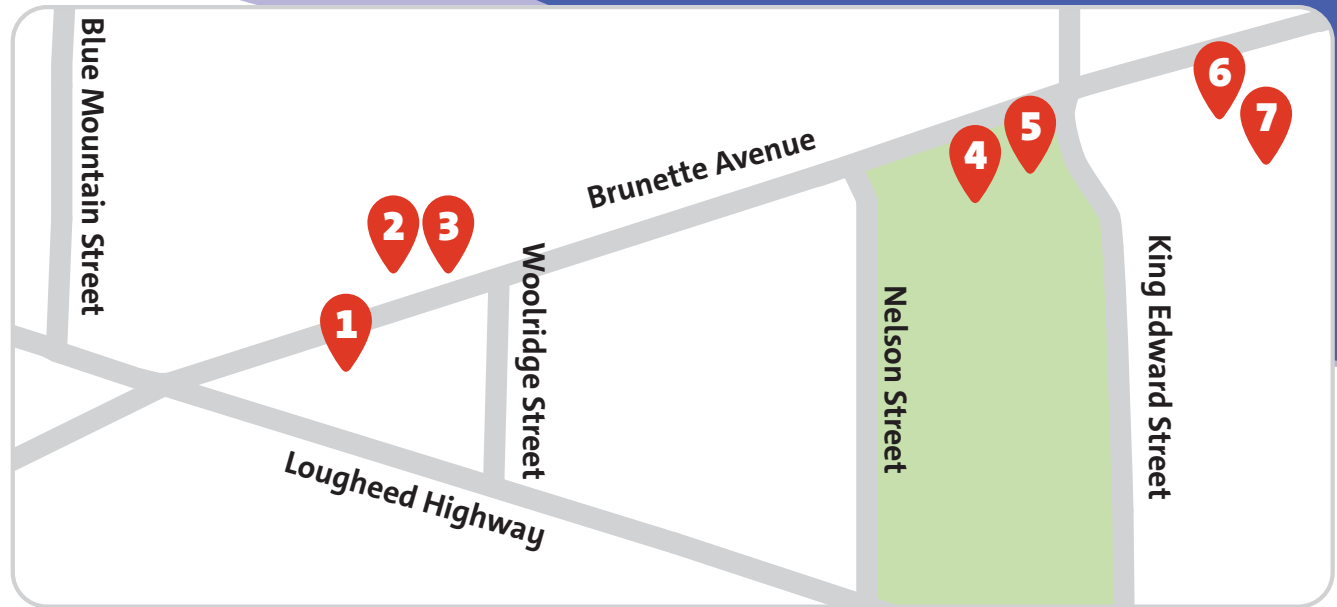

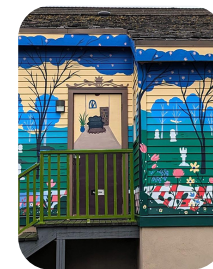
