

What We Heard

From mid-May to July 2021, the City engaged with the public on three Neighbourhood Pockets as part of Phase 2 of the Southwest Housing Review. The second phase of this multi-year planning process looked at three **Neighbourhood Pockets** – sub-areas within the Burquitlam-Lougheed Neighbourhood Plan – to help guide future development and land use in Southwest Coquitlam.

Public Engagement

The public engaged in a variety of ways. Specifically, we heard from the public through an online survey that ran from June 15 to July 5, and held a public engagement session for each of the three pockets.

In general, each of the three pockets had very similar themes for feedback including:














What We Heard

After reviewing the proposed land use concept, we asked participants what their level of support was. This is what they told us:




More park space is needed to support the growing community. We asked participants whether to expand Miller Park or to develop a new, more centrally located park.




Whiting-Appian Pocket
